



# Risks Online Victimization




#### What do we know?

- 2. Self-produce sexual material (Boundaries between sexual exploration and abuse experiences)
- 3. Peer Victimization (adults did not leave)
- 4. CSE online extreme modalities
- 5. Industries with weakness in protection

- Active detection (disclose supported)
- Prevention (realistic, children and YP centred and collaborative)
  - Support victims
- Working with families (parent or adult mediation)
  - Mentalize adults
    - Prosecution
